The Damage Deposit will be refundable at the termination of occupancy under conditions described in the Residence Hall Handbook. Students entering a residence hall or contracting for a meal plan for the second semester will be charged one half the appropriate total annual fee. All rates apply to multiple occupancy rooms. **There is a surcharge of \$1,350 per year for single rooms.** A meal plan is required for all resident students except students living in the Graduate House or 523 Newbury St. Non-resident meal plans are available.
